#### What is PYRUKYND?

PYRUKYND is a prescription medicine used to treat low red blood cell counts caused by the early breakdown of red blood cells (hemolytic anemia) in adults with pyruvate kinase (PK) deficiency. It is not known if PYRUKYND is safe and effective in children.

### **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION**

PYRUKYND may cause serious side effects, including:

• Rapid breakdown of red blood cells (acute hemolysis) has happened after suddenly interrupting or stopping treatment with PYRUKYND. You should not suddenly stop taking PYRUKYND. If you have to stop your treatment with PYRUKYND, your healthcare provider should monitor you closely. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you develop any signs or symptoms of breakdown of red blood cells including yellowing of the skin or the whites of your eyes (jaundice), dark colored urine, dizziness, confusion, feeling tired, or shortness of breath

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# Get the rundown on financial support programs for PYRUKYND® (mitapivat) tablets

If you're eligible for financial support, we can help you find programs for accessing PYRUKYND. Our Patient Support Managers will guide you every step of the way—from enrollment forms to insurance questions and challenges.



For eligible patients with a prescription and approval from their insurance:

# PYRUKYND fulfillment and delivery

The specialty pharmacy will fulfill your prescription. If your doctor and insurance company determine you are eligible for treatment, we will deliver PYRUKYND to your door.



For eligible patients with commercial insurance:

# **PYRUKYND Copay Program**

This program lowers the cost to \$0 per prescription if you're eligible, regardless of how much you make. Support is available for those who qualify.

Patients participating in government healthcare insurance are not eligible.



For eligible patients with state and government or private insurance:

# Independent foundations

Independent foundations may be available to help you with out-of-pocket expenses. myAgios® Patient Support Services or our specialty pharmacy can provide more information.



For eligible patients who are uninsured or underinsured:

# Patient Assistance Program (PAP)

This program may be able to help you access PYRUKYND, if you are eligible. Income restrictions apply.



For eligible patients who experience an interruption in health insurance coverage:

# Access for coverage interruption

This program offers temporary access to free product for eligible patients.

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# **Important Safety Information (cont.)**

The most common side effects of PYRUKYND® (mitapivat) tablets were decrease in reproductive hormone (estrone) in men, increased salt from uric acid (urate) blood test, back pain, decrease in reproductive hormone (estradiol) in men, and joint pain (arthralgia).

These are not all the possible side effects of PYRUKYND. Call your healthcare provider for medical advice about side effects. You may report side effects to the FDA at 1-800-FDA-1088 or www.fda.gov/medwatch.

# Before taking PYRUKYND, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have liver problems
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if PYRUKYND will harm your unborn baby. Tell your healthcare provider right away if you become pregnant or think that you are pregnant during treatment with PYRUKYND
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if PYRUKYND passes into your breast milk. Talk to your healthcare provider about the best way to feed your baby during treatment with PYRUKYND

### **Important Safety Information (cont.)**

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines that you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. PYRUKYND and certain other medicines may affect each other causing side effects. PYRUKYND may affect the way other medicines work, and other medicines may affect how PYRUKYND works. Know the medicines you take. Keep a list of them to show your healthcare provider or pharmacist when you get a new medicine.

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
